## PPKS Hosts IBM Coding Workshop for Students of SMK DPHA Gapor Stampin

Hands-on Experience for Students in Artificial Intelligence, Machine Learning Technologies, Designing and Building Chatbots

On 10 March 2018, Pusat Pembangunan Kemahiran Sarawak (PPKS) hosted the IBM Coding Workshop for sixty-six (66) students from SMK Datuk Patinggi Haji Abdul Gapor Stampin, Kuching.

Held at the International College of Advanced Technology Sarawak (i-CATS), a subsidiary of PPKS, the workshop was a joint initiative between the Ministry of Education, Science and Technological Research Sarawak (MESTR), IBM and PPKS. 15 IBM volunteers from 10 countries, with the assistance of 31 PPKS/i-CATS staff members and interns facilitated the coding workshop.

Aptly titled 'SkillsBuild: Watson Maker Workshop', the main objective of the 3-hour workshop was to introduce students to chatbots and show how human-computer conversation services work. In a nutshell, a chatbot is a computer programme designed to simulate conversation with human users, especially over the Internet.



During the workshop, the students learned about artificial intelligence, machine learning technologies and were introduced to the key concepts related to designing and building an empathetic chatbot. For the students, a major highlight of the workshop was the hands-on approach, as they worked on designing and programming chatbots to contribute towards the betterment of society.





Sharing his thoughts on the workshop, Mr. Hallman bin Sabri, PPKS Executive Director highlighted, "On behalf of the PPKS Group of Institutions, I wish to express my thanks to the Ministry of Education, Science and Technological Research Sarawak and IBM for co-organizing this workshop. We live in an age characterized by breathtaking advances in technology and an ever-evolving economic landscape. It is therefore important for all of us to prepare the youth for a world filled with exciting opportunities. Indeed, this workshop is in line with the ongoing initiative by the State Government to reach out to the community and promote the importance of Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) education."

# Meeting of the Minds Sets the Focus on Talent Development

The Meeting of the Minds which was held on 6 February 2018 at a leading hotel in Bintulu, has set the stage for a host of initiatives, with a focus on talent development to meet the needs of the Sarawak Corridor of Renewable Energy (SCORE).

Co-organized by the Ministry of Education, Science and Technological Research Sarawak (MESTR) and Pusat Pembangunan Kemahiran Sarawak (PPKS), the Meeting of the Minds was officiated by Yang Berhormat Dato Sri Michael Manyin Anak Jawong, Minister of Education, Science and Technological Research Sarawak. In his address, Yang Berhormat Dato Sri Michael Manyin highlighted that the Meeting of the Minds was timely and in tandem with the State Government's ongoing initiatives and strategies to boost economic development throughout the State of Sarawak. To boost Human Capital Development in Sarawak and prepare for Industry 4.0, he shared that the Ministry of Education, Science and Technological Research had identified relevant issues, challenges, needs and opportunities to formulate a comprehensive plan to improve the education system in Sarawak. An important area was to address the mismatch of skills among university graduates.



The Minister emphasized that one of the strategies formulated by the Ministry was to increase enrolment in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) related fields in Schools, TVET and Higher Learning Institutions. He shared that the national target for STEM education was 60 percent. However, it was only around 19 percent in Sarawak.

The Ministry had also implemented various initiatives to improve English Language proficiency in schools. In this respect, he urged PPKS and other training providers to emphasize English as the delivery language. Indeed, he stressed that the various strategies would go a long way to boost the ongoing Human Capital Development initiatives and keep at bay, the Curse of the Luxury of Natural Resources; the paradox that certain countries with great natural resource wealth tend to have slower economic growth than resource-poor countries.

The Minister also shared that the State Government had emphasized the importance of Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET) in producing the much needed human capital to support the state's development initiatives.

In his speech, PPKS Executive Director, Mr. Hallman bin Sabri highlighted that the Meeting of the Minds was an ideal platform for the government, academia and key industry representatives from the energy-intensive heavy industries located in the Samalaju Industrial Park to engage in lively discourse about various issues such as Strategic Human Capital Development, Industry 4.0 and advances in Materials Science. To support Sarawak's development initiatives, Mr. Hallman bin Sabri shared that PPKS would set up a Metallurgy and Materials Science Training Centre which would provide relevant training in the field of Metallurgy and Materials Science for industries in SCORE and nationwide.

In this respect, he emphasized that the signing of two Memoranda of Understanding (MoUs) during the event, first between PPKS and the Institute of Materials Malaysia, followed by the MoU between PPKS and the Materials Processing Institute, United Kingdom would pave the way for PPKS to offer Certified Training Programmes (Materials Science and Technology Programmes) from these institutions. This would also facilitate the exploration of joint initiatives in the area of Customized Training Programmes, Consultancy, and Research and Development (R & D).



Mr. Hallman bin Sabri also took the opportunity to express his thanks to Yang Berhormat Dato Sri Michael Manyin Jawong and his team members from the Ministry, the Regional Corridor Development Authority (RECODA), the British High Commission, Kuala Lumpur, the various representatives from the industries, and distinguished speakers (comprising representatives from the government, industry and academia) for their tremendous support in making the Meeting of the Minds a reality.
