

The 'Main Event' during the quarter was the Sarawak Skills 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Dinner on 23 August 2019. Held at the Riverside Majestic Hotel in Kuching, the highlight of the dinner was the launch of Sarawak Skills' new corporate logo by the guest of honour, The Right Honourable Datuk Patinggi (Dr) Abang Haji Abdul Rahman Zohari Bin Tun Datuk Abang Haji Openg, Chief Minister of Sarawak.

In his address, The Right Honourable Chief Minister highlighted, "We need more of our youths to be well equipped with high tech skills and knowledge as we want local talents to spearhead Sarawak's development and progress. ## Students' Final-year Project Facilitates Promotion of Handicrafts Through Social Media



wo final-year students of the Sarawak Skills Development Centre (PPKS) assisted a local entrepreneur to promote her products through social media.

The final-year students of the Skills Diploma in Information System Administration Programme (DKML4), namely Orientina Valencia Ajik Anak Isik and Tan Tze Yen started the project in November last year as part of the final year syllabus.

"We came up with the idea in November last year and proposed it to our instructor, Mr. Muhammad Zaiemi Bin Jeraie. From our research, we found out that there was an opportunity to promote local handicrafts such as handmade bags, earrings, purses and necklaces by Runai Borneo Crafts. Therefore, we decided to boost the promotion of these items through social media and we were able to attract more customers nationwide," said the students when sharing on their project.

The owner of Runai Borneo Crafts, Ophelia Vanessa Runai Ak Isik, who is also the elder sister of Orientina shared that through the project, she was able to reach out to customers nationwide and Negara Brunei Darussalam. "Now, I can do my business online, and this project has made my products more well-known and increased my income. Sometimes, the students also assisted me at our booth during exhibitions or events," said Ophelia. Commenting on her future plans, Ophelia said that she would like to market her products internationally.

Meanwhile, Orientina said she plans to continue her studies in Business Management at the Bachelor's degree level while Tan Tze Yen plans to work after her graduation.

## Final-year Project Transforms Stall Owner's Business
