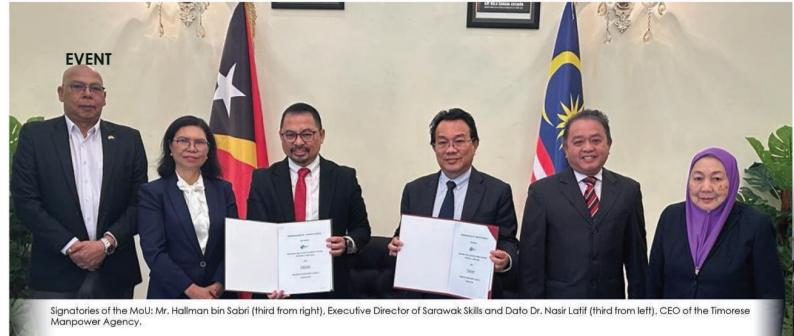

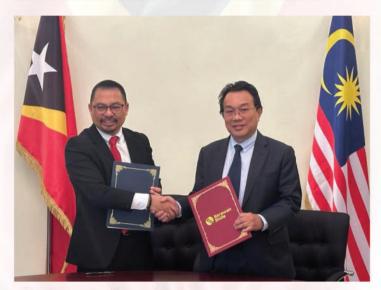
Sarawak Skills Inks Mou with **Timorese Manpower Agency**

he Sarawak Skills Group of Learning Institutions (Sarawak Skills) and the Timorese Manpower Agency have entered into a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) to advance various talent development initiatives for the benefit of secondary school leavers and working adults in Timor-Leste.

Held on 13 February 2024 at the Embassy of the Democratic Republic of Timor-Leste in Kuala Lumpur, the signatories of the MoU were Mr. Hallman bin Sabri, Executive Director of Sarawak Skills and Dato Dr. Nasir Latif, CEO of the Timorese Manpower Agency. Her Excellency Joana Veneranda Amaral (Ambassador of Timor-Leste in Malaysia), Yang Berbahagia Tan Sri Datuk Amar (Dr) Haji Abdul Aziz bin Dato Haji Husain (Chairman of Sarawak Skills) and Yang Berbahagia Dato Hajjah Maznah binti Dasmi (Secretary of the Sarawak Skills Management Council) witnessed the signing of the MoU.

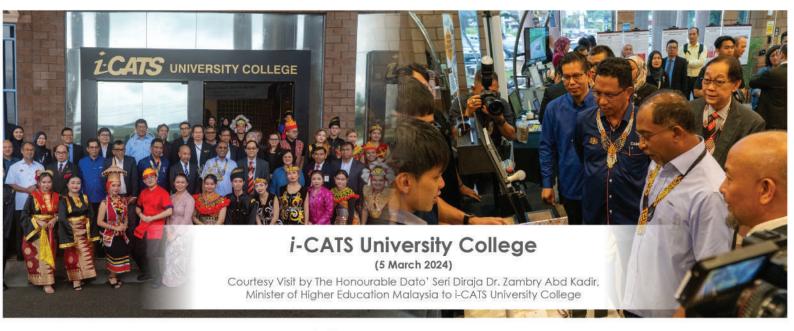
