The Green Mobility Innovation Summit was held on 8 and 9 September 2025 at the Imperial Hotel, Kuching, Sarawak, bringing together over 700 delegates from national and international backgrounds to explore advancements in sustainable transportation and clean mobility technologies.

The summit was officiated by the Honourable Dato Sri Roland Sagah Wee Inn, Minister for Education, Innovation and Talent Development, Sarawak, who represented The Right Honourable Datuk Patinggi Tan Sri (Dr) Abang Haji Abdul Rahman Zohari bin Tun Datuk Abang Haji Openg, Premier of Sarawak.

Jointly organised by the Ministry of Education, Innovation and Talent Development, Sarawak (MEITD), the Brunei Darussalam–Indonesia–Malaysia–Philippines East ASEAN Growth Area (BIMP-EAGA), and Sarawak Skills, the summit was held under the theme “Driving the Future: Talent, Innovation & Sustainability in Green Mobility.”

In his officiating address, Dato Sri Roland Sagah highlighted Sarawak’s strong commitment to fostering innovation, sustainability, and talent development in line with the Post COVID-19 Development Strategy 2030 (PCDS 2030). Cooperation in Halal Industry Development Enhanced Through TESDA Halal Competency & Internal Audit Training

The Road to Halal Professional: Competency & Internal Audit Training concluded after a dynamic seven-day programme aimed at strengthening halal industry expertise through regional collaboration. Held from 24 July to 1 August 2025, the training brought together 15 participants from the Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA), Philippines, for an intensive course on halal certification, standards, and industry practices.

The programme was co-organised by Sarawak Skills, Universiti Teknologi MARA (UiTM) Sarawak Branch, and TESDA, in collaboration with the Ministry of Education, Innovation and Talent Development, Sarawak (MEITD), the Ministry of International Trade, Industry and Investment Sarawak (MINTRED), and the Sarawak Bumiputera Entrepreneurs Chamber (DUBS).

During the closing ceremony, Professor Dr. Firdaus Abdullah, Rector of UiTM Sarawak Branch, emphasised that the training was designed to deliver technical knowledge, practical exposure, and capacity building in Halal Competency and Internal Halal Audit, aligned with Malaysia's JAKIM standards.

"It combined lectures, site visits, and audit simulations, including tours of certified halal facilities such as Sara-Bif Restaurant, Halal Abattoir, and the Corned Beef Factory. For UiTM Sarawak Branch, this is more than just a training programme, it reflects our strategic commitment to strengthening the halal ecosystem, both within Sarawak and beyond," he said.

Mr. Hallman bin Sabri, Executive Director of the Sarawak Skills Development Centre and Chairman of the Federation of Malaysian Skills Development Centres (FMSDC), also spoke at the ceremony, highlighting the significance of cross-border collaboration in positioning Sarawak as a key contributor to the global halal economy.

"Sarawak is proud to support partnerships that foster knowledge-sharing, professional development, and economic growth. This training is a prime example of how international cooperation can elevate the standards and scope of the halal industry," he said.

"This programme would not have achieved its success without the dedication of the trainers from UiTM Sarawak, the facilitation team from Sarawak Skills, and the active coordination from TESDA. It also forms part of the BIMP-EAGA outcomes under the Social and Education Cluster. We are truly grateful for their invaluable contributions," Mr. Hallman added.

SARAWAK SKILLS SUPPORTS SARAWAK'S GREEN ECONOMY INITIATIVES THROUGH HYDROGEN FUEL CELL VEHICLE SAFETY AND AWARENESS TRAINING

Sarawak Skills, under its hydrogen-focused training initiative, has conducted the *Hydrogen Fuel Cell Vehicle Safety & Awareness Training*, a significant step in advancing the Sarawak Government's green economy agenda. This groundbreaking programme highlights Sarawak Skills' commitment to sustainable, forward-looking technologies and strengthens its position as a key enabler in Sarawak's transition to cleaner energy.

Held on 31 July 2025 at Sarawak Skills Tabuan Jaya, Kuching, the training equipped the participants with crucial knowledge and awareness of hydrogen fuel cell vehicle (HFCV) technologies, with a strong focus on safety standards and handling practices.

Mr. Hallman bin Sabri, Executive Director of Sarawak Skills, emphasised the importance of this milestone, stating, "Sarawak Skills is proud to be the only training centre in the state and national level to undertake a hydrogen-specific training programme. In fact, the first cohort of trainees came from Peninsular Malaysia. This not only aligns with the government's green aspirations but also empowers our local talent with the skills needed for the hydrogen economy."

This initiative comes on the heels of a strategic collaboration between Sarawak Skills and its partners in China, a move that further cements the institution's role in the development of hydrogen expertise. Through this international partnership, Sarawak Skills has gained access to advanced hydrogen training modules, technologies, and expertise, ensuring that local training standards meet global benchmarks.

STEM Catalysts 2025

Empowers Over 1,000 Students in Baram

Long Lama, Baram – The STEM Catalysts Raspberry Pi 2025 programme marked a major milestone in SMK Long Lama, the 17th and largest stop of the statewide tour, drawing over 1,000 participants from across Baram's rural schools. The event, held in conjunction with SMK Long Lama's Diamond Jubilee Celebration, was graced by The Honourable Dato Sri Roland Sagah Wee Inn, Minister for Education, Innovation and Talent Development, Sarawak.

In his keynote speech, the Minister paid tribute to the school's 60-year legacy in nurturing Baram's future leaders and called on rural communities to embrace science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM) as the foundation for Sarawak's next chapter.

"It is no longer acceptable to say that reading, writing and counting are enough for rural children. Our future depends on our ability to master science, technology and digital knowledge. You too can excel in coding and STEM regardless of your location," said Dato Sri Roland.

The STEM Catalysts programme, implemented in partnership with University of Technology Sarawak and Sarawak Skills, is a one-day touring STEM carnival. The carnival was held at 18 districts across Sarawak from April to July 2025. It brought engaging hands-on exhibits and interactive activities to more than 160 rural schools, exceeding its original target of 130, and reached over 6,000 pupils.

In Baram, students travelled from as far as SK Long Lapok to participate in the programme at SMK Long Lama. Activities included robotics, drone racing, hydraulic systems, hydrogen experiments, AI-controlled arms, and coding education promoted by the *Fondation Rolf Schnyder*.

Students were guided by a team of 20 trained STEM communicators who brought the science behind each exhibit to life. Many students reportedly asked for longer sessions, and several teachers expressed interest in acquiring the exhibits for continued use at their schools.

The Minister extended his appreciation to programme co-sponsors, namely SMD Semiconductor Sdn Bhd, Press Metal Berhad, and Socoe Sdn Bhd, along with institutional partners Sarawak Skills, University of Technology Sarawak, Sarawak Science Centre, and the *Fondation Rolf Schnyder*.

Dato Sri Roland also expressed how proud he was to see the efforts of Sarawak Skills in promoting STEM education among students in rural areas like Long Lama, adding that their commitment plays a crucial role in bridging the digital divide and nurturing future-ready talents across Sarawak. He also commended Jabatan Pendidikan Negeri Sarawak (JPNS) and Kementerian Pendidikan Malaysia (KPM), for their strong support, expressing hope for continued collaboration.

As Sarawak pursues its 60% STEM enrolment target by 2030, YB Dato Sri Roland concluded with a challenge and a vision, "Today, we celebrate SMK Long Lama as a beacon of education. Tomorrow, let's celebrate it as the bastion of STEM innovation in Baram."
