t PPKS, the second quarter of the year presented us with numerous opportunities to facilitate the advancement of our theme for 2018, 'A Stronger PPKS'. In this respect, the support of our major stakeholders, namely the Government and Industry, has been the wind in our sail, to propel us in our ongoing quest to produce a qualified and competent workforce through continuous learning and development.



With Industry 4.0 and the Digital Economy at our doorstep, there is a need for all of us to fly the flag of excellence in the face of change. There is also an urgent need for all stakeholders to stand shoulder to shoulder to facilitate the noble objectives of contributing to the betterment of society and nation building. In this respect, this year, we have embarked on another wave of transformation, and put into high gear, various strategic initiatives to ensure that the gentle shower of education fulfils our objective of developing an industry-relevant, future-ready workforce. For example, in April 2018, as part of our Guest Speaker Series, PPKS hosted a sharing session on Industry 4.0 and the Internet of Things (IoT). Held in PPKS Tabuan Jaya, Kuching, the sharing session by Mr. Royce T.S. Tan, Director of Cross Selling and Energy Solutions, Robert Bosch Sdn. Bhd. brought home the importance of Industry 4.0 and IoT, in particular, how such technologies shape the vibrant canvas of industry, government and academia.

In June 2018, with the support of the Ministry of Education, Science and Technological Research Sarawak and the State Education Department, we signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with thirty-two secondary schools from Kuching, Samarahan and Serian Divisions. This has paved the way for a host of joint initiatives aimed at enhancing the teaching and learning landscape at the secondary schools. In addition, students from the participating schools will enjoy a special rate for Registration Fee should they further their studies at PPKS and i-CATS. PPKS will also initiate the Best Student Award for the participating schools.

We live in an exciting age characterized by an evolving economic landscape, shaped by dizzying advances in technology. Tectonic shifts in the global industry and societal trends have become the norm. To facilitate our students' seamless transition from the classroom to the world of work, PPKS has formed a task force to enhance teaching and learning across our range of programmes and campuses. This will go a long way to ensure that our students will thrive, not just survive, in the global environment.

he signing of the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between Pusat Pembangunan Kemahiran Sarawak (PPKS) and thirty-two (32) secondary schools from Kuching, Samarahan and Serian divisions on 27 June 2018 will pave the way for a host of joint initiatives aimed at enhancing the teaching and learning landscape at the secondary schools.

Held in the PPKS Auditorium at Tabuan Jaya, Kuching, the MoU exchange between PPKS and the secondary schools was officiated by Berhormat Dato Sri Michael Manyin Anak Jawong, Minister of Education, Science and Technological Research Sarawak. In his address, Yang Berhormat Dato Sri Michael Manyin commended the Management of PPKS for spearheading this timely initiative - a Smart Partnership between PPKS and the various secondary schools to advance the noble initiative of Human Capital Development. He was pleased to note that in the pipeline were customized training programmes and workshops for school teachers and students such as Teaching and Learning Workshops, Leadership and Skills Camps, Motivational Workshops for Students, ICT-related Workshops and various events to facilitate awareness of the Digital Economy and Industry 4.0. The Minister highlighted that these activities were in line with the State Government's ongoing initiative to transform Sarawak's educational landscape. He also shared that with the importance of Industry 4.0 and the Digital Economy in Sarawak, there was an urgent need for the various industry sectors in Sarawak to leapfrog from Industry 2.0 to Industry 4.0.



The Minister also shared that the State Government had placed emphasis on the importance of Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET) to produce the much needed human capital to support the state's development initiatives. He emphasized that there was a need to remove the stigma of TVET, i.e. playing second fiddle to academic education. With the importance of TVET in developing a skilled workforce, his Ministry was spearheading the initiative to adapt the dual training system, as practised in Germany. Through the dual system, upon completion of their studies, students would have industry-relevant skills which would facilitate their transition to the workplace. With regard to teaching and learning, the Minister commended PPKS for promoting the use of English. His Ministry had also implemented various initiatives to improve English Language proficiency in schools. He also shared on Finland's success in transforming its education system.

In his welcoming speech, PPKS Chairman and President of the International College of Advanced Technology Sarawak (i-CATS), YBhg. Tan Sri Datuk Amar (Dr) Haji Abdul Aziz bin Dato Haji Husain highlighted that the signing of the MoU between PPKS and the secondary schools, an integral part of the PPKS School Adoption Programme, affirmed the mutual commitment of the stakeholders to enhance the vibrant canvas of teaching and learning at the secondary schools. In facilitating the School Adoption Programme, PPKS would commit resources from its talent pool and share best practices in Industrial Education and Training.







YBhg. Tan Sri Datuk Amar (Dr) Haji Abdul Aziz also announced that students from the participating schools would enjoy a special rate for Registration Fee should they further their studies at PPKS and i-CATS. In addition, PPKS would initiate the Best Student Award for the participating schools. Under the programme, PPKS would work closely with the secondary schools and the Parent-Teacher Associations to organize various activities for the teachers and students. He expressed his hope that through the programme, the students' intellectual fires would be ignited as they progressed along their academic voyage.

To facilitate the transformation of TVET in Sarawak, YBhg. Tan Sri Datuk Amar (Dr) Haji Abdul Aziz also shared that PPKS was committed to working closely with the Ministry of Education, Science and Technological Research Sarawak to look into adapting the dual system training, as practised in Germany, to meet the needs of industry in Sarawak. In line with the Digital Economy, PPKS would set up a dedicated Industry 4.0 Lab and a Metallurgy and Materials Science Training Centre. This would go a long way to contribute towards the development of both our present and future workforce. He also took the opportunity to thank Yang Berhormat Dato Sri Michael Manyin Anak Jawong for his support and presence to officiate at the event. He also thanked Puan Hajah Rakayah binti Haji Madon, State Education Director, for working closely with the PPKS team members and secondary schools to make the event a reality.

Other VIPs and invited guests present at the event were Puan Norzilawati bt. Md. Tajudin, Ketua Unit, Unit Perhubungan dan Pendaftaran, Sektor Pengurusan Sekolah (who represented Puan Hajah Rakayah binti Haji Madon, State Education Director), Hajah Khaninah bt. Haji Ariff, Principal Assistant Secretary, Ministry of Education, Science and Technological Research Sarawak, Yang Berbahagia Dato Hajjah Maznah binti Dasmi, Secretary of PPKS Management Council, Members of the PPKS Management Council and Mr. Hallman bin Haji Sabri, PPKS Executive Director.

Opportunity for Working Adults to Earn Chargeman L1 Certificate in Competency at PPKS Subsidiary Company

he Sarawak Electrical Industry Training Institute (SEITI), a subsidiary company of Pusat Pembangunan Kemahiran Sarawak (PPKS), welcomes applications from working adults for its Chargeman L1 programme. Registration for new students are held twice a year in April and August at SEITI, located at the Tabuan Laru Commercial Centre in Kuching.

Established in 2011, the Sarawak Electrical Industry Training Institute has been accredited by the Electrical Inspectorate Unit (EIU), Ministry of Utilities, Sarawak as a Training and Examination Centre for the following Certificate(s) of Competency: Wireman Second Grade (Low Voltage Single Phase Installations), Wireman First Grade (Low Voltage Three Phase Installations and Single Phase Installations) and Chargeman L1 (Low Voltage Main Switchboard and Auxiliaries).

With regard to the Chargeman L1 programme, Mr. John Rizal Biki, PPKS Kuching's Campus Director cum General Manager of SEITI highlighted that the programme is offered on a part-time basis to enable working adults to enhance their professional skills and competencies. He also shared that applicants should not be less than 21 years old and have more than 3 years' working experience in handling electrical equipment and be experienced in controlling live (electrical) equipment. They should also have completed secondary school education (up to Sijil Pelajaran Malaysia (SPM) level) and possess any one of the following electrical certificates: G1/G2/SKM2/SKM3 or equivalent qualification(s).

Mr. John Rizal emphasized that during the programme, students would gain invaluable hands-on experience in Switchboard Operation, Instrument and Measurement, and Motor Control. He also commented that the programme prepares graduates/ trainees for a wide range of career opportunities across the commercial and industrial sectors. Indeed, with the Certificate of Competency in Chargeman L1, graduates can look forward to exciting careers across the length and breadth of industry.
